

ICD-10 and Version 5010 Compliance Timelines

Everyone affected by the Version 5010 and ICD-10 transitions – health care providers, payers, ensure compliance.

Date	Compliance Step
January 1, 2010	Payers and providers should begin internal testing of Version 5010 standards for electronic claims
December 31, 2010	Internal testing of Version 5010 must be complete to achieve Level I www.cms.gov compliance
January 1, 2011	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Payers and providers should begin external testing of Version 5010 for electronic claims • CMS begins accepting Version 5010 claims • Version 4010 claims continue to be accepted
December 31, 2011	Internal testing of Version 5010 for electronic claims must be complete to achieve Level II Version 5010 compliance
January 1, 2012	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All electronic claims must use Version 5010 • Version 4010 claims are no longer accepted
October 1, 2013	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Claims for services provided on or after this date must use ICD-10 codes for medical diagnosis and procedure • CPT codes will continue to be used for outpatient services

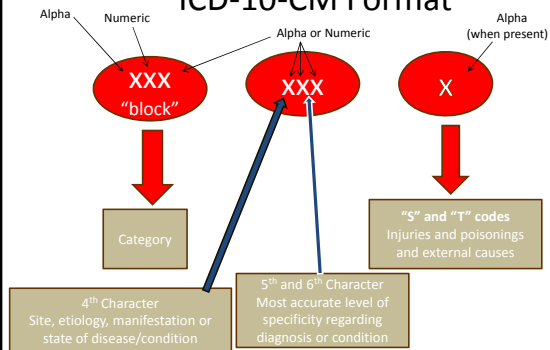

ICD-10-CM is Better...

1 + 2 + 3 = CODE
First three digits share common traits

ICD-9 vs ICD-10 Twice the codes!

- Not type of injury/wound

Facts About ICD-10-CM

- First character always alpha
- 2nd and 3rd digits always numeric
- 4th -7th alpha or numeric
- Flexible for adding new codes
- Very specific
- Laterality (left and right)
- Specificity improves coding accuracy
- Interoperability and exchange of information with other countries

Increased Denied Claims

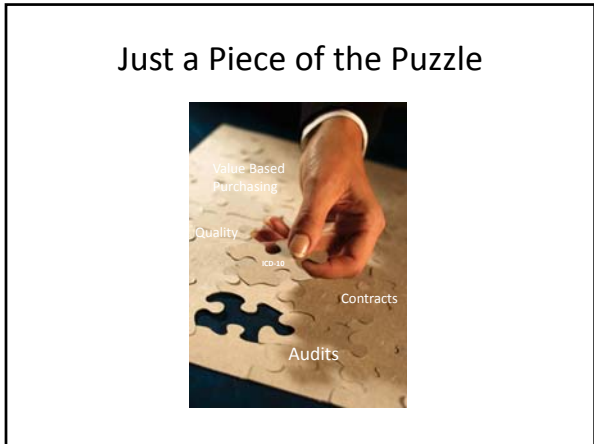

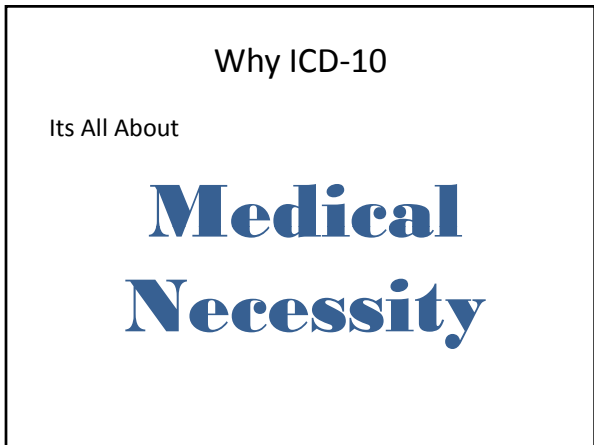

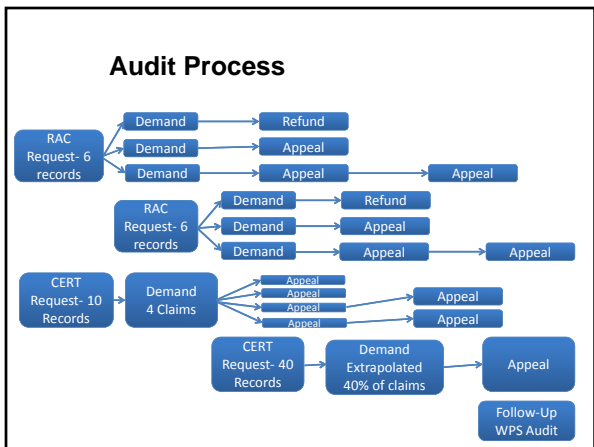

Value-Based Payment Modifier

- “Establish a payment modifier that provides for differential payment to a physician. . . Based upon quality of care furnished compared to cost during a performance period.”
- Additional Factor to the RBRVS Calculation
- Risk Adjusted
- Budget Neutral
- Effective
 - January 1, 2015 for specific physicians (outliers, costly conditions)
 - January 1, 2017 for all physicians

PQRS and Other Quality Metrics

- Triggered by the Diagnosis
- Determination of Quality Depends on the Accuracy of the Data
- Will be Reported on Physician Compare Website

Contracting and Coverage

- All ICD-10 codes must be accepted
- Not required to be included in coverage policies
- NCDs, LCDs, and private coverage policies are commonly ICD driven
- Payers will now have more specificity available
- Specificity of diagnosis may impact coverage of a service
- Policies will change 10/1/2013 and may not be exact crosswalk

RISK

- Testing-Testing-Testing
- Potential delay in Medicare payments


- ▶ **EXTERNAL testing should have begun by January 1st of this year.**
- ▶ **If you haven't tested, been approved, and moved into production by January 1, 2012, you won't be able to submit claims and cash flow will be negatively affected.**
- ▶ **Confirm your business partners are engaged in testing with other external partners with whom they work- crucial to comprehensive testing.**

Converting Data




- GEMs are not a substitute for learning how to code with ICD-10




- For some small conversion projects it may well be quicker and more accurate to use ICD-10 code books instead of GEMs

Partial Code Freeze




- Last regular, annual updates to both ICD-9-CM and ICD-10 were made on October 1, 2011
- On October 1, 2012 there will be only limited code updates to both ICD-9-CM & ICD-10 code sets to capture new technology and new diseases.
- On October 1, 2013 there will be only limited code updates to ICD-10 code sets to capture new technology and new diseases.

Partial Code Freeze



- There will be no updates to ICD-9-CM on October 1, 2013 as the system will no longer be a HIPAA standard.
- On October 1, 2014 regular updates to ICD-10 will begi
